POST-FLIGHT INFORMATION

1. Background

- 1.1. In accordance with the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO), the Aeronautical Information Service (AIS) is responsible to provide the Air Traffic Management (ATM) Community with timely and accurate information essential for the safety, regularity and efficient Air Navigation.
- 1.2. In order to comply with the aforementioned, Air Traffic and Navigation Services Company (ATNS) introduced a Post-flight information reporting system on the 15th of July 1999.

2. Purpose

- 2.1. The purpose of the Post-flight information reporting system is to ensure that any inadequacies or hazards, observed by pilots and operators in the course of their operations, relating to ATS procedures, services and facilities essential to the safety and or efficiencies of air navigation are reported to the authority or service providers responsible.

✦ **3. Procedure for the collection of post-flight information**

- 3.1 Pilots, air crew and operators intending to participate in the provision of Post-flight information, are to complete the Post-flight reporting form and submit it to the ATNS Aeronautical Information Management Unit (AIMU). The Post-flight reporting form can be submitted via the following media:
 - 3.1.1 Electronically via the ATNS website. www.atns.co.za
 - 3.1.1.1 Click on the AIM button, then select and click on the Post-flight Report button from the submenu.
 - 3.1.1.2 Complete the electronic form.
 - 3.1.1.3 Click on the Submit button.
 - 3.1.2 Manually by faxing the completed form to +27 11 975 1592.
- 3.2 Post-flight information received will be recorded, evaluated, verified if required and appropriate action taken.
- 3.3 The intention of this publication is not to replace the system of reporting aircraft accidents and incidents.
